Students generally take seven courses each semester. Students must have department recommendations to take AP, honors, and PSU courses, which are weighted and receive an extra point on our 4.0 grading scale. We recommend limiting these honors classes to two per semester. PSU courses are taught at SMA but receive college credit at neighboring Portland State University.

Impacts throughout the past two years

Standardized Testing

The ACT and SAT tests in our area have been repeatedly cancelled over the past two years. We offered an April SAT test in our school to students who desired to participate.

Athletics and Student Activities

Student Activities and Organizations were limited from March 2020 through June 2021. Athletics seasons were adjusted and some of our athletic competitions were able to take place in Spring 2021. Most sports and Student Activities resumed in Fall 2021.

2019-2020

From March 16, 2020 through the end of the semester, we provided:

- Synchronous and asynchronous instruction within an adapted bell schedule;
- Classes in 60-minute blocks on M, Tu, Th, F from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm;
- An expectation that students meet with their teachers and actively participate;
- An open schedule on Wednesdays for study time and student support;
- Letter grades based on student academic performance; although we did not administer final exams.

Because all students have iPads, we were able to move all classes online on March 16th, 2020 without a break in instruction. We are confident in the rigor and quality of instruction during COVID-19. Per the Governor's orders, all athletic competitions were canceled.

In addition to COVID-19, during 2020, Portland-area students experienced prolonged racial equity protests.

2020-2021

In addition to the pandemic, Portland-area students experienced prolonged racial equity protests, and the 2020-2021 school year began amid widespread Oregon wildfires requiring evacuation and creating unhealthful air for over 10 days.

The 2020-2021 academic year, we held classes online from September 2020 through March 2021, in compliance with our Governor's orders. We continued our online approach with some adjustments intended for hybrid learning:

- We added SWIVL classroom technology to improve lecture and lab experiences;
- Class time per block was increased to 75-minutes.
- classes in 60-minute blocks on M, Tu, Th, F from 10:00am to 3:00 pm;
- Wednesday was devoted to club meetings and community, social and academic support time
- The elimination of final exams for semester one courses.

From March of 2021-June 2021

St. Mary's resumed in-person instruction four days a week. Students could choose to remain online or to resume in-person instruction. We continued to devote time on Wednesdays to club meetings, community building, and other co-curricular pursuits.

2021-2022

SMA is offering full in person instruction and has resumed our five day a week schedule with 75-minute class periods two to three times per week. There is no routine online instruction unless a student affected by COVID (illness or exposure/quarantine) requires online instruction.

In response to the need for student support and socioemotional learning, St. Mary's has incorporated flex blocks into our weekly schedule. This allows students time to engage in community building activities and seek academic support from faculty and staff.
